Our student from 2016 completes his time at Curtin University

2016 saw Jeremy Zhang from Singapore our latest student recipient of the AIF Malaya Nursing Scholarship - complete his Bachelor of Science (Nursing) at Curtin University. Jeremy's achievement was justly celebrated at a ceremony and reception held at Australian Red Cross in Perth on 27 October last year. In acknowledging the Scholarship, Jeremy thanked the people of Perth for their hospitality, friendliness and specifically mentioning the beautiful beaches and air quality, as well as saying how wonderful it was to see the whole sky, something that is difficult to do in central Singapore. Jeremy was the first AIF student to do clinical placements and spoke about the personcentred care approach to nursing that he saw while working in Perth hospitals, saying he hoped to take the approach back to Singapore. In concluding, Jeremy mentioned that he wanted to 'be the change you want in the world' and was determined to make a greater contribution to his profession as a result of the Scholarship and his experiences in Perth.

Of that clinical placement, Jeremy wrote in his student report:

I did my placement at Armadale Health Service (Acute Medical Unit). I believed that the inclusion of clinical placements would be beneficial for future Scholarship recipients. AIF recipients, like myself, who either are Malaysians or Singaporeans are generally lacking in exposure to a diverse culture and a different healthcare system. I believe that the experiences and knowledge gained during this placement are priceless.

Anzac Day 2016

Each year, our students join the Red Cross contingent for the Anzac Day march in Perth. Jeremy wrote of his impressions:

Unfortunately, 25th April 2016 was a damp day for Perth. However, that did not stop the crowd from viewing the ANZAC Day march held right in the heart of Perth's CBD. I was impressed to see many young Australian children and adolescents at the parade, cheering the marchers. The weather had taken a turn for the worst, yet the crowd stayed on, cheering and clapping. In fact, the cheering and clapping were louder when it started pouring heavily. I did not mind marching through the city even though I was drenched. I caught a cold after the march and still it did not bother me. I was so inspired and motivated by the audience in the Anzac Day parade. This is a memory that I will never forget.
